The Trip to Bountiful, written by Texas' own Horton Foote, was published first in 1954 after the successful TV premier in 1953 with Lillian Gish and Eva Marie Saint on NBC. The 1985 film starring Geraldine Page was adapted by Horton Foote from his television play.

Horton Foote is known for his characters and stories of the time. He writes about "little"/"regular"/"down home" people-- people whose lives and concerns are not worldly, nor philosophically or artistically shaped. Rather they operate day to day, intent on stability. Other Horton Foote successes: "Tender Mercies" and his Oscar-winning screen adaptation of "To Kill a Mockingbird." And you can look forward to seeing his "Dividing the Estate" in Dallas!
